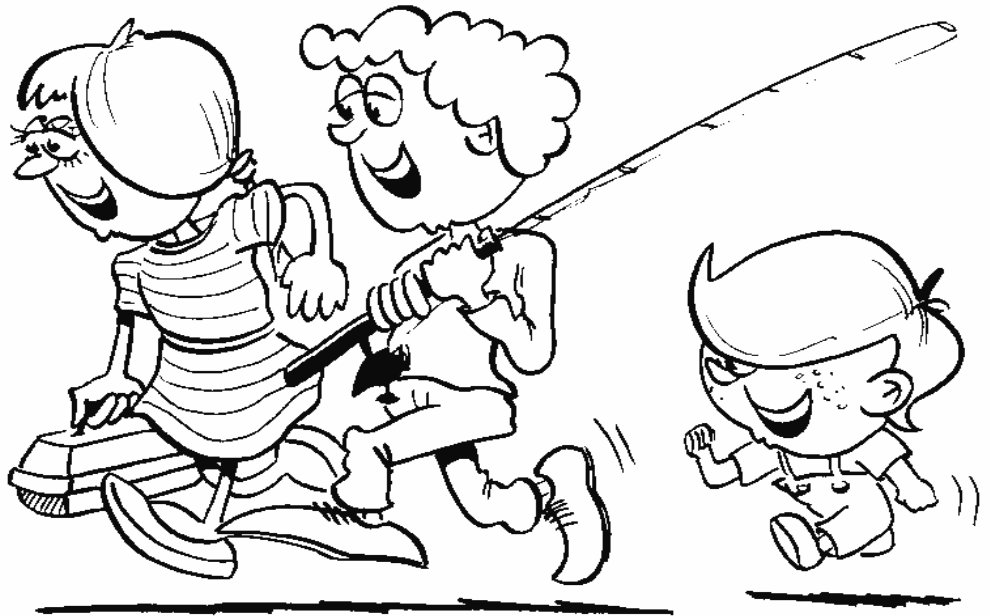
Phonic Decoding

Onset Variation : 'br' as in 'brook' | 'sh' as in 'shook'

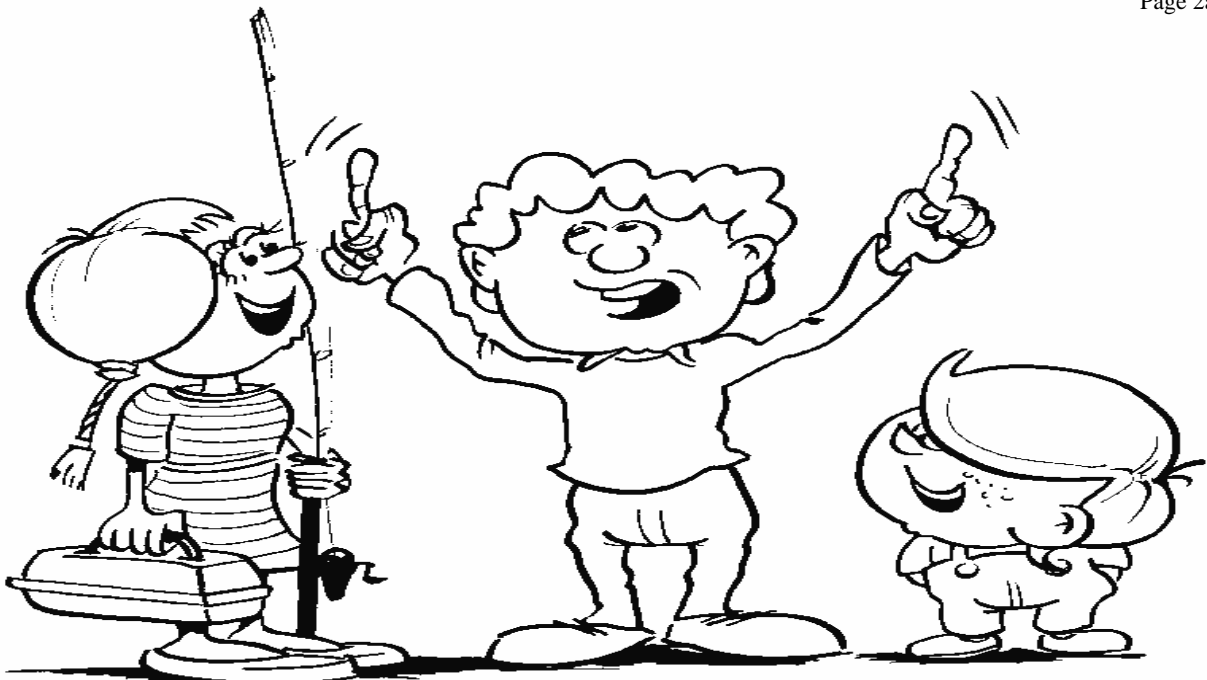
Try These New Words

threw walked

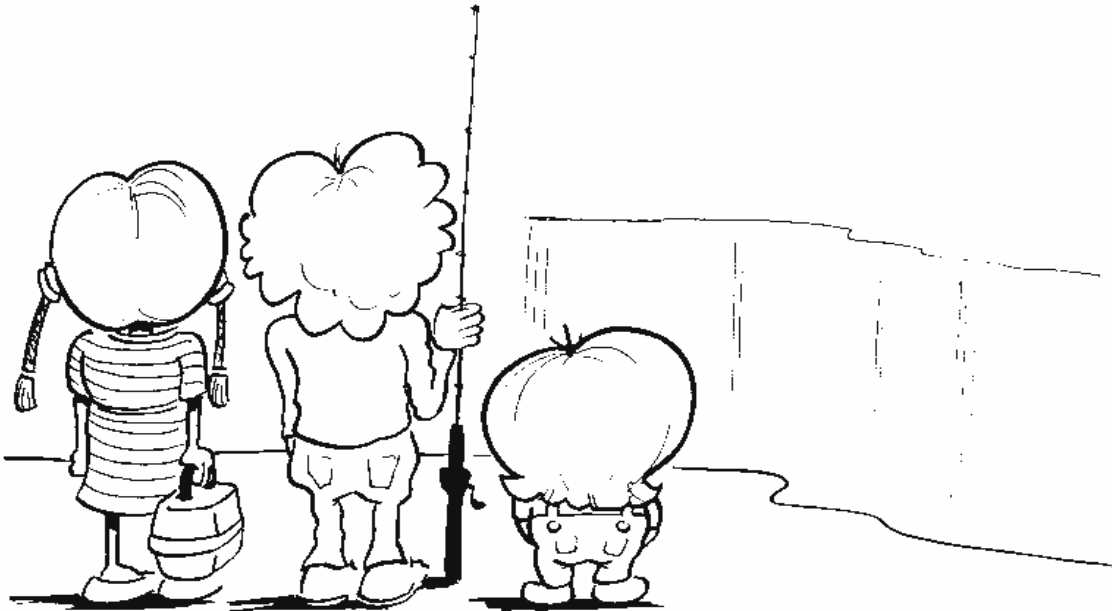


We took a hook down

back for Dad to cook.

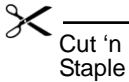
