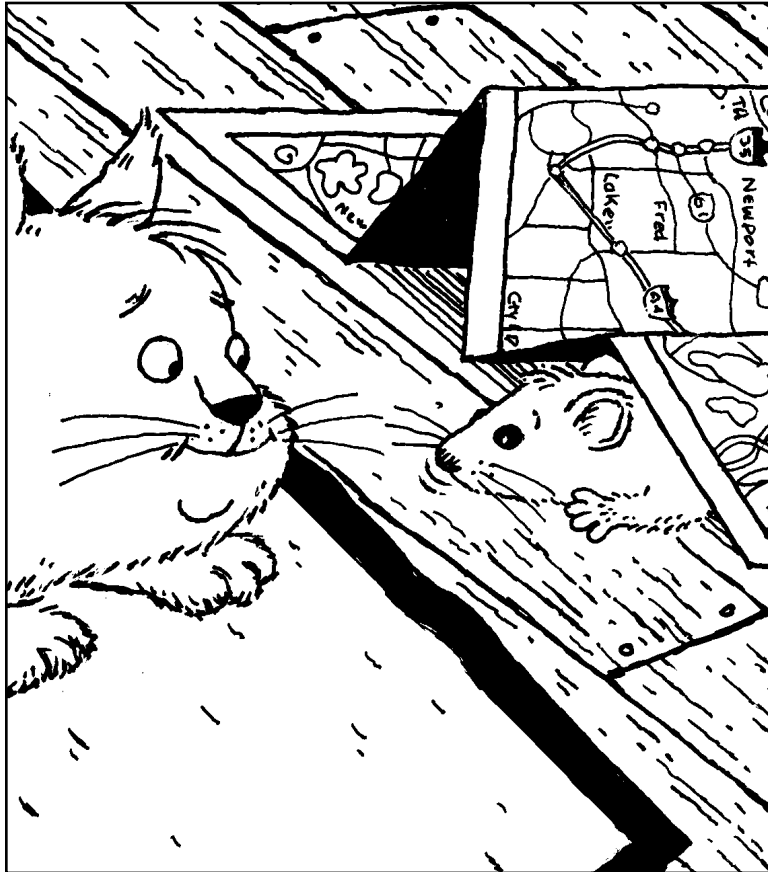

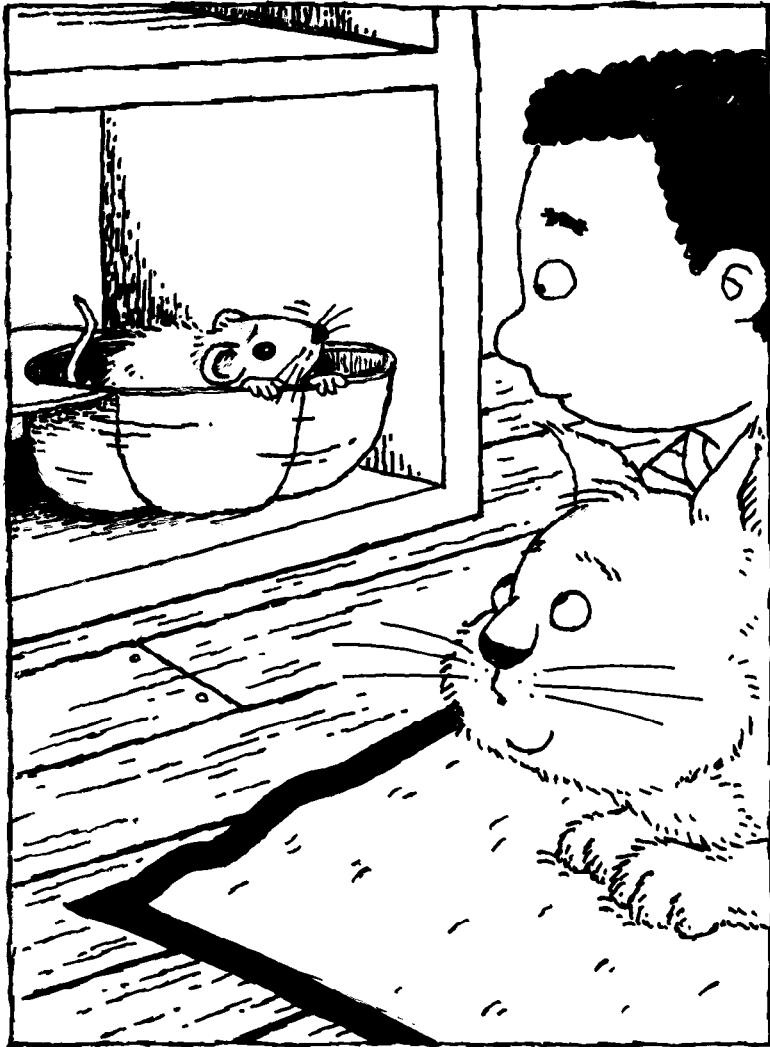

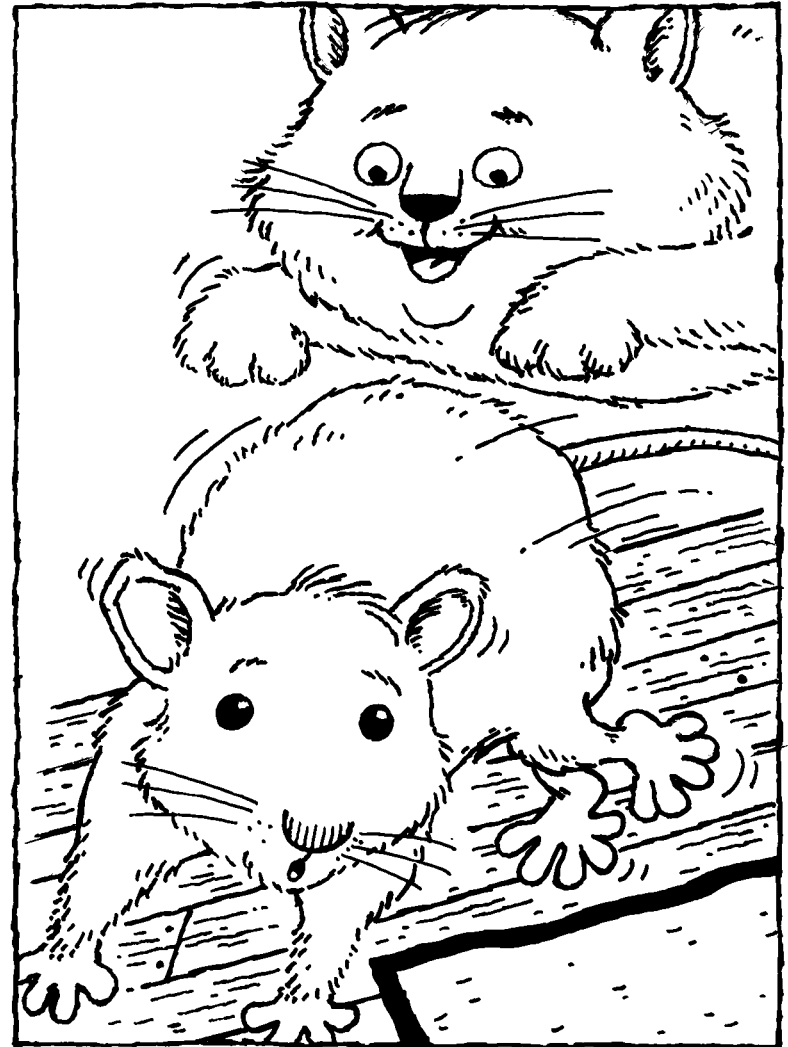
Nat liked to sit on the mat

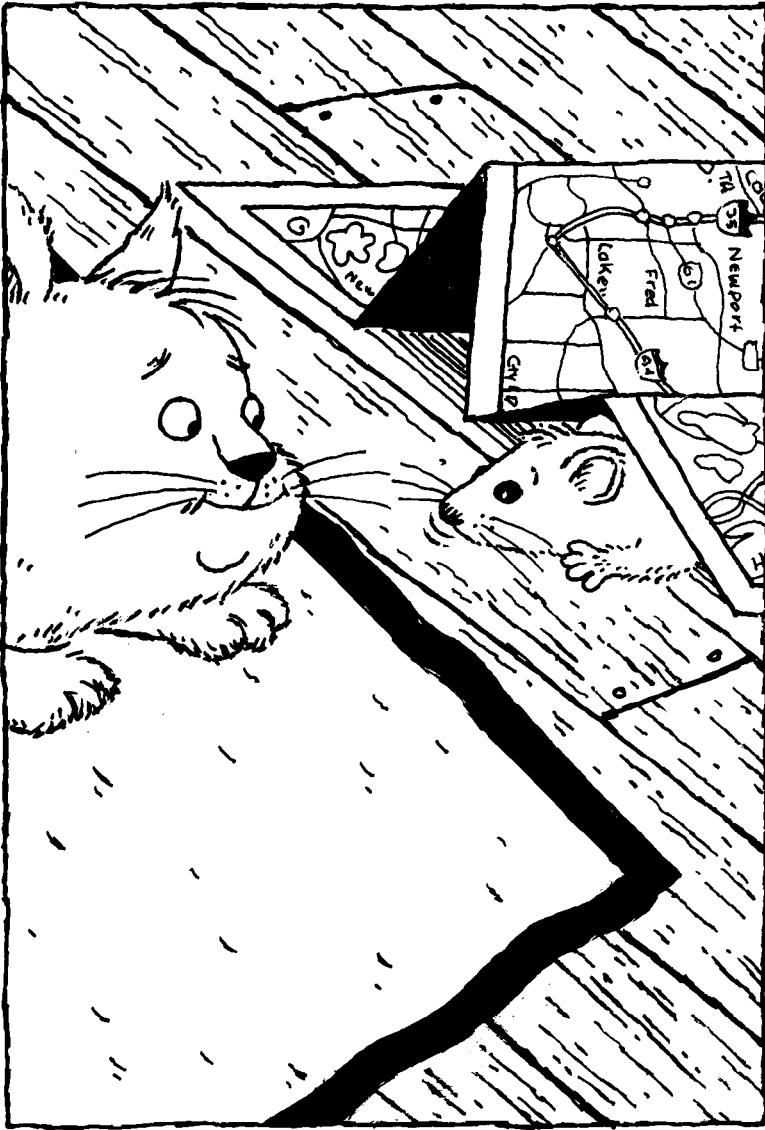

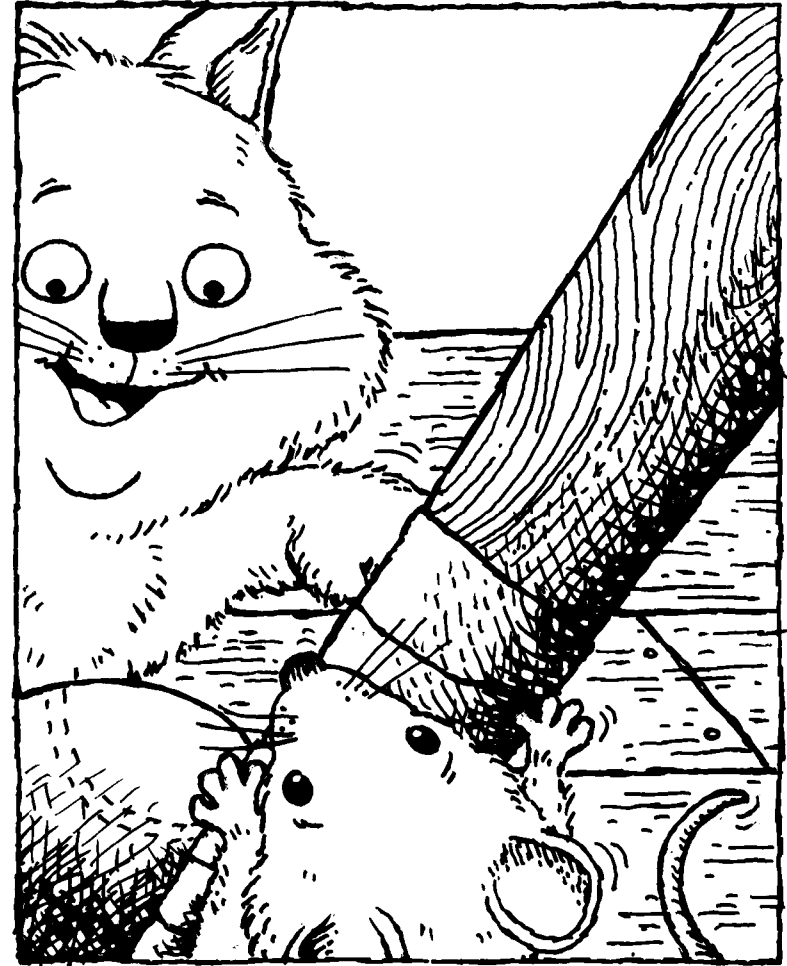
Nat was on the mat

the rat.



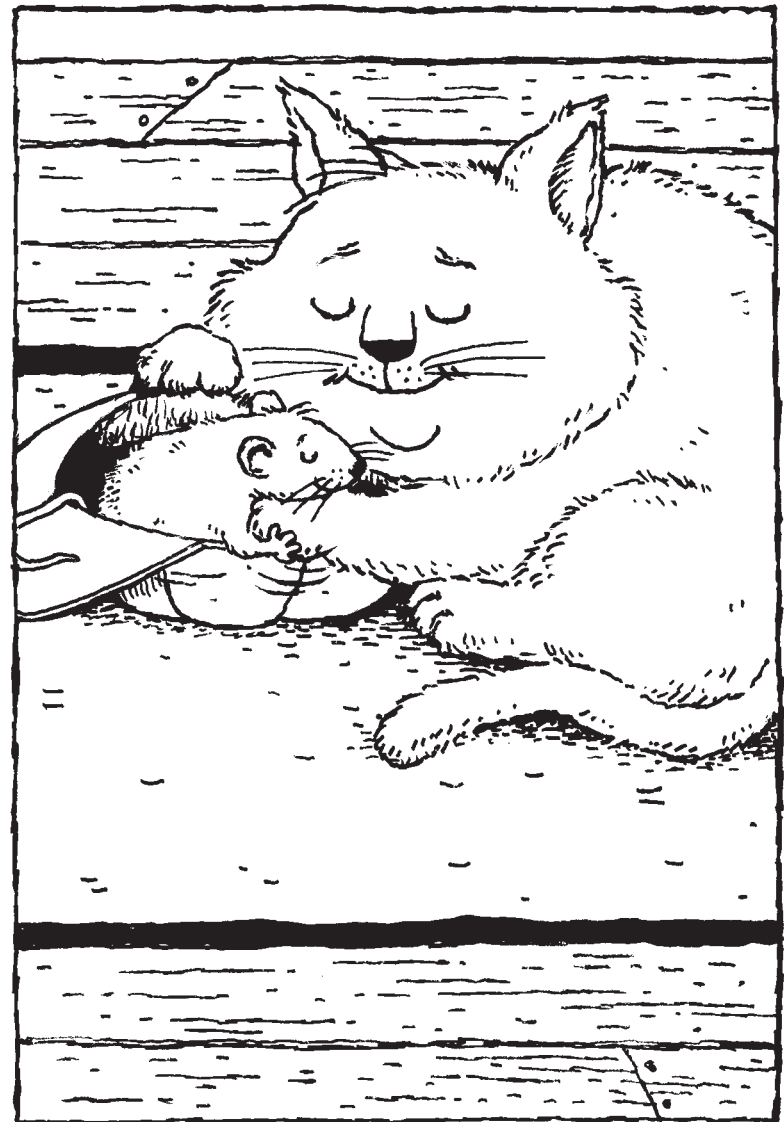
"Stop, cat!" said Meg.
